Walloon prime minister Elio Di Rupo says this decision was prompted by the rulings of the International Court of Justice (ICJ). African Union (AU)	The African Union has suspended Israel’s <a href="#">observer status at the bloc</a> , which is why it was not invited to attend the summit in Addis Ababa, Ehtiopia. AU Commission chief Moussa Faki Mahamat: "The status is suspended until such time as this committee can deliberate ... and so we did not invite Israeli officials to our summit". South Africa	South Africa announced that it was <a href="#">recalling all of its diplomats from Tel Aviv</a> "for consultation."The South African government cited "the refusal of the Israeli government to respect international law" and its "genocidal airstrikes" against Palestinians. Bahrain	Bahrain's government confirmed a statement from parliament that it had <a href="#">recalled its ambassador to Israel</a> and that Israel's ambassador to Bahrain had returned home, Reuters reported. (November 2 2023)				
Jordan	Foreign Minister Ayman Safadi has said it is “immediately” <a href="#">recalling its ambassador to Israel</a> in response to the war in Gaza, accusing Israel of creating an “unprecedented humanitarian catastrophe”. (1 November 2024)				
Turkey	Turkey <a href="#">recalled its ambassador to Israel</a> , citing the “unfolding humanitarian tragedy in Gaza” and Israel's refusal to heed calls for a ceasefire, according to a <a href="#">statement</a> from the Turkish MFA. The move followed <a href="#">Israel's decision</a> to recall its own diplomats from Turkey for security reasons. (4 November 2023)

United States					Imposes “ <a href="#">new visa restriction policy</a> targeting individuals believed to have been involved in undermining peace, security, or stability in the West Bank, including through committing acts of violence or taking other actions that unduly restrict civilians’ access to essential services and basic necessities. Immediate family members of such persons also may be subject to these restrictions” (5 December 2023)

Belize	Belize announced that it was <a href="#">suspending diplomatic ties with Israel</a> while reiterating its call for an “immediate ceasefire.” (14 November 2023)				
Nicaragua			Nicaragua has <a href="#">threatened to take Germany, UK, Netherlands and Canada to the ICJ</a> if they do not halt their weapon supplies to Israel. In a <a href="#">bilingual statement</a> the Nicaragua government: “calls on UK, Germany, the Netherlands and Canada to immediately halt the supply of arms, ammunition, technology and/or components to Israel as they may have been used to facilitate or commit acts of genocide in Gaza.”

Bolivia	Bolivia <a href="#">cuts diplomatic ties with Israel</a> (31 October 2023): Bolivia “decided to break diplomatic relations with the Israeli state in repudiation and condemnation of the aggressive and disproportionate Israeli military offensive taking place in the Gaza Strip,” Deputy Foreign Minister Freddy Mamani				
Brazil	Minister Mauro Vieira, <a href="#">summoned Israeli ambassador</a> Daniel Zonshine to appear at the Itamaraty Palace, in Rio. And called for consultations the Brazilian ambassador in Tel Aviv, Frederico Meyer. (19 February 2024)				
Colombia	President of Colombia, Gustavo Petro <a href="#">recalls its ambassador to Israel</a> and warned that his country would break off diplomatic relations if Israeli forces did not stop attacking civilians in the Gaza Strip: “I have decided to recall our ambassador to Israel for consultations. If Israel does not stop the massacre of the Palestinian people, we cannot be there,” (1 November 2024)				

Chile	Chile president Boric <a href="#">recalls Israeli ambassador</a> over attacks in Gaza, (November, 2023)		Chile and Mexico <a href="#">refer to the ICC the "situation in the state of Palestine"</a> to investigate probable crimes within its jurisdiction. Chile MFA PR: "What we are interested in is supporting the investigation of any possible war crime that has been committed in the area, wherever it comes from, whether it is war crimes committed by Israelis or Palestinians and war crimes that have been committed in the territory." Honduras	Foreign Affairs Minister Eduardo Enrique Reina said that President Xiomara Castro has <a href="#">recalled its ambassador to Israel</a> in condemnation of the "genocide and other serious violations of international law that the civilian Palestinian population is suffering in the Gaza Strip". Mexico			Mexico and Chile <a href="#">refer to the ICC the "situation in the state of Palestine"</a> to investigate probable crimes within its jurisdiction. Mexico supports the ICC as a forum to "establish individual criminal responsibility" and "investigate crimes committed during the conflict in Gaza whether committed by agents of the occupying power, or occupied power". And refers to ICJ genocide case: "Mexico reiterates its commitment to international justice, the prevention of genocide and other war crimes and crimes against humanity." (18 January 2024)

Malaysia		Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim announced the decision <a href="#">to impose the maritime ban on Israel-affiliated vessels</a> – singling out ZIM, Israel's largest shipping firm. "The Malaysian government decided to block and disallow the Israeli-based shipping company ZIM from docking at any Malaysian port". (20 December 2023)

Dutch Court		<a href="#">Ordered</a> the Dutch government to stop sending spare parts for F-35 fighter jets to Israel saying there was "a clear risk" that serious violations of international human rights law were being committed in the Gaza Strip with the use of Israel's US-made fighters. (12 February 2024). The complaint was <a href="#">filed</a> by Oxfam Novib, Vredesbeweging PAX Nederland and The Rights Forum in the NL.			
French Court	**France's top Administrative court <a href="#">ruled</a> that demonstrations in support of Palestinians cannot be categorically banned as it violates the freedom of expression, but it should be considered on a case-by-case basis. The rule is against the French Ministry of interior decision to forbid pro-Palestinian rallies on the grounds of public order. (18 October 2024).
